LOCATIONS TO START RESEARCH IN PALM BEACH COUNTY

1. At home in family files-look for birth, marriage, and death certificates. Look for family letters, Bibles, etc.
2. Talk to family members. Remember family pictures, particularly ones with dates and names.
3. Visit the Palm Beach Public Library Reference section. Ask for "Where Once We Walked" by Mokotoff & Sacks to learn the latitude and longitude of the town you are researching. The lat & long never changes, but the names do with political turn over. Make copies of the maps.
4. Visit the FAU Wimberly Library-Special collections for Yizkor books and lots more. Translating help is available there, too. Appointment required.
5. Visit the JGSPBCI collection at the Sandler Library. It is located on Glades Road and 95th Ave. Call ahead for an appointment with our Librarian.
6. Visit the Family History Center of the Church of Latter Day Saints at 1530 West Camino Real (just east of Military Trail).
